3. **Action Item:** Begin the process of publishing a new hardcopy Director targeting publication this Fall (POC: Marilyn Nagle, ETC: 1 November 2015).

Liturgy Report - Sept 2015

Liturgy Committee Business Meeting – Minutes of Aug. 11, 2015

Alternate Lectionary Translations

Offering liturgy planners alternate translations of the readings to enhance gender inclusiveness has proven to be more time consuming and complex than expected. Committee members discussed other approaches and agreed to trial a different method starting with planning for Advent. We will advise planners to consider gender inclusiveness as they review/reflect on the readings for their liturgy and request an alternate translation from the liturgy coordinators if they find the USCCB text to fall short.

Teen Passion Play for Holy Week

The group discussed the Religious Education team's suggestion to incorporate a dramatic presentation of the Passion at one of the Holy Week liturgies. After discussion, those present agreed this would fit best within the Good Friday service. Adjustment to the usual procession with the cross would be in order if the cross is already carried within the drama. Maggie Atkinson and her team are looking for an appropriate script.

Suggestion to include food donations in Presentation of the Gifts

Bill Meers has made a suggestion that a basket of donated food items be carried in the offertory procession once a month. He feels this would spur more outreach in the form of donations of food and other items. After discussion, Linda agreed to explore this idea with Tom and Margie Hudnell, who coordinate donations for St. Vincent de Paul.

***Result:** Tom & Margie are asking for donations of fresh produce on the first Sunday of each month. These donated food items will then be part of our Offertory Procession. The liturgy planner that Sunday each month will need to gather people to help carry the baskets to the altar.

Upcoming Liturgical Celebrations

The Sept. 6 liturgy will include a blessing for community members offering ministries of compassion. There was discussion about a blessing of liturgical ministers at another upcoming liturgy; this idea was tabled for now in light of the upcoming commissioning/blessing of catechists (Sept. 20) and QAC coordinators (Sept. 27).

Planning for Advent will occur on Sunday, Sept. 6 after Eucharist using a team approach for the season. Linda commented that the *Year of Mercy* called for by Pope Francis begins during Advent. We want to explore ways to support this theme in Advent and throughout the coming year's liturgies and in the Children's Liturgy of the Word.

The Feast of the Immaculate Conception, Dec. 8, falls on the same day as the monthly community meeting. After discussion the group suggested that the feast day liturgy replace the December community meeting. Ken Moran has agreed to this.

information items

- The Crossroads program for QAC high school students will have a session called "Why Liturgy" on Jan. 3, 2016. Linda and Bob will be part of that session to talk about QAC's approaches to effective liturgical celebrations.
- Linda distributed a draft liturgical calendar for the upcoming year. She invited committee members to review and comment.
- Teesie is working to secure congregational music for the "Mass of Rejoicing" she will be introducing. Links to online recordings will be available as well.
- Bob suggested that Deacon Greg distribute an email to community members asking them to look for and return any communion pyxes. The supply is very low.
- The Liturgy Committee's next quarterly business meeting will be at 6:30 p.m. Tuesday, Oct. 13, immediately prior to the October community meeting.

Bishop Mtumbuka from Malawi will be at QAC On September 13. There will be a reception for him in Si-lounge following Mass. Because of this visit the **Healing Service** for September has been postponed until October 4.
