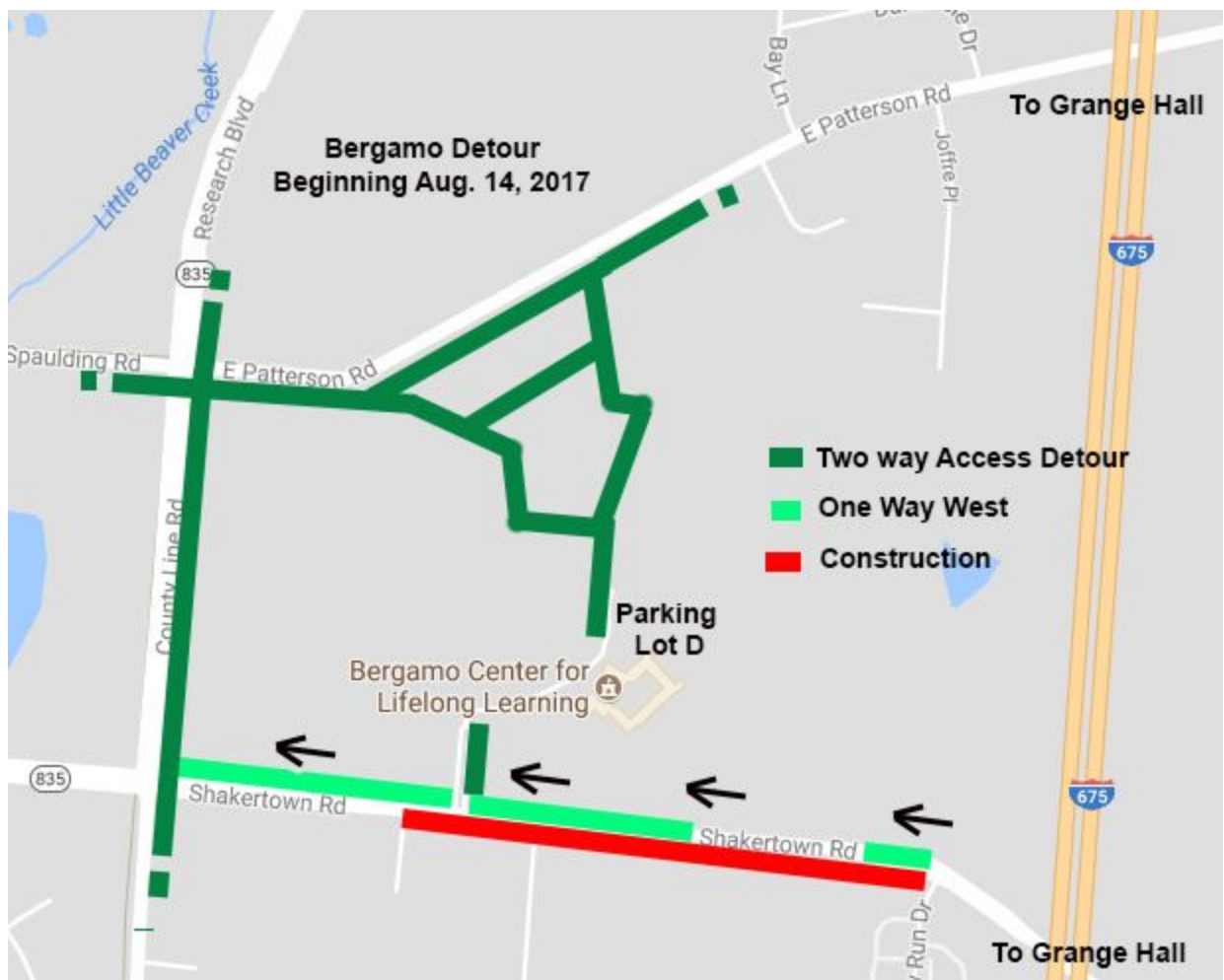


Shakertown Road Construction Detour

Street widening and sidewalk construction will be taking place over the next three months in front of the main entrance to Bergamo Center. Shakertown Road will close for eastbound traffic only, on August 14th. Westbound traffic will be open during the whole construction period. (This means visitors and staff can turn on to Shakertown from Grange Hall, for example, and enter Mount St. John at the Shakertown Entrance. Motorists could also leave Mt. St. John via Shakertown Road and head towards County Line Road.) Otherwise, motorists should use the E. Patterson Road Entrance/Exit. Shakertown should be back open to two lanes in November.



Bergamo Roofing Construction Details

Work on the Bergamo roof will begin Monday, Aug. 14. Command Roofing is the contractor. Jeff Bohrer is our main contact with the contractor. The roofers have a schedule of events for the Bergamo Center for every conference space used and will do their best to work around this schedule to minimize any noise or disruption.

Workers will be parking in Lot C. Their work day will typically run from 7:30 am to 5:00 pm and they may work on Saturdays. The roofers are aware of the construction on Shakertown and may be coming through the property by way of the Patterson entrance. If there is much chance of rain at all they will usually call off work for that day. They will very rarely be inside the Bergamo building. They will have their own portable toilet mounted on the roof.

The roofer's main staging area will be the visitor parking area behind Bergamo on the south side of the building. A crane and dump truck will be parked in that area next to the building on a daily basis. Tarps will cover the windows looking out onto the staging area from the Fireplace Lounge. Safety stanchions will surround the equipment. There will still be Bergamo & Mount Saint John employee access at both back doors on either side of the staging area, but please proceed with caution.

For guest safety there will be safety stanchions at the front entrance and on some days, even a roofing employee on the ground directing pedestrian traffic when work is going on up above nearby.
